CIFORD Activities on Female Genital Mutilation (FGM)



Girls Empowerment and campaign against FGM

This is a project aimed at empowering women and girls through forums, seminars and workshop. This is to help reduce the marginalization of women and girl child in Meru community. The project further aims at helping the women to be social economically empowered. CIFORD has a program to empower the girl child through the campaign against FGM and mentorship. There are Alternative Rite of Passage seminars which take six days and follow up to form girls peer clubs. Some of the topics which are taught during the seminars for girls are:

Drug and substance abuse
STI/HIV/AIDS
Alternative Rite of passage
Skills and self realization, girls education

Teenage pregnancy and early marriages
Reproductive Health
Ameru traditions and history of FGM Life
Rape and its effect.




