


CIFORD (Community Initiatives for Rural Development) Kenya International Project by Margaret Ikiar received a grant from SI Conejo. Contributions can go a long way in Kenya Africa who help to educate and empower girls - funds can assist with essentials like Water Towers, Clay Stoves, and goats for milk



CIFORD Kenya is working in Meru County to empower women and girls in Meru County of Kenya East Africa. Traditionally, Young girls of age 11 to 15 years went through seclusion period where they underwent the female genital Mutilation to pass to adulthood. (Womanhood.) During the seclusion, the girls were trained on how to be good wives and mothers. They were also removed part of the clitoris for her to be obedient to the husband and also reduce the sexual desire. This operation could at times be very dangerous and even leave girls dead or infected with diseases.

The project activities are to educate the girls on the facts of Female genital mutilation against the myths so that they can make informed decisions. Apart from the FGM issues, girls are taught about issues affecting girl child today and some of these challenges are Sexuality and HIV/AIDS. Drug and substance abuse, teenage pregnancy and early marriages. Self-realization and life skills.


