

SIOCV History by Marcy Shewmon

When I moved to Thousand Oaks, there was no Soroptimist club in my area. I had been in the Santa Clarita club for about 4 years prior and really missed having a club locally. Myself and 15 others decided to start a club in the Conejo Valley. We chartered in 1982. Dixie Vollmer was one of our first members of the 15 and owned The Plug Nickel in Westlake Village and offered her restaurant

to host our meetings. We met in the library room for several years. Our first President Diane Upton, lasted abut 7 months and resigned due to work restrictions. I took over the remainder of that year and served the next year as President. Over the 40 years I have been in this club, I have served as President seven times, Recording Secretary for several years and a Director.

We started out with smaller fund raising projects, but always had enough to give to our local charities. At one point we were up to about 30 members, which I believe is the most we have had. Over the years, our club has grown and declined in membership, but even our past members stay in touch and support the club. We developed quite a close knit group and the relationships that were developed have remained to this day.

When I reached my 25th year with the club, the members surprised me with a membership to the Laurel Society. I was quite surprised and taken back by their generosity.

My daughter, Debbie Cutler, joined the club and became our Treasurer and remained in that position for several years, She has also served as President for 3 years. I have always been very proud of her contribution to the club and her dedication to serving our community.






REMOTE MEETINGS! WE ARE SO OVER IT, BUT WE MANAGE TO HAVE FUN!





















WITH ZOOM, WE ARE ABLE TO CONNECT IN A BETTER WAY!
