Roasted Zucchini with Parmesan

PREP TIME: 5 min

SERVES: 4

Ingredients

2	medium sized zucchini, cut into 1/2 inch thick rounds
1/2 cup	grated parmesan cheese
1 tsp	garlic powder
2 tbsp	olive oil
3/4 tsp	sea salt
1/2 tsp	pepper



Method Preheat oven to 450°F In a large bowl toss the zucchini with olive oil salt, pepper and garlic powder.

Arrange on a baking sheet, top with grated parmesan cheese and bake on center rack for 5 minutes, next broil the zucchini for 2-3 minutes or until cheese is golden brown.
